Schulz Spur Nove **Italian Settlers Centennial Celebration July 11- 12, 2014**

I was raised in a small Italian rural community about 7 miles north of Merrill Wisconsin called Schulz Spur. Beginning in 1914 until 1922 there were 9 immigrant Italian families who settled in **Schulz Spur**. My grandparents, Luigi and Armelinda Ricci

along with their 5 children were the first of www.schulzspurnove.com (click on the the 9 families to buy 100 acres to settle in the Schulz Spur community.

I began working on the genealogy of my Italian heritage two years ago when I realized it would be 100 years in 2014 since the families began settling in the Schulz Spur community.

Last July 2013, I called 2-3 people from each of the 9 immigrant Italian families who lived in the Merrill area to ask if they would like to consider a celebration. We had 30-40 people show up for a meeting at a local restaurant in Merrill. It set the celebration in motion as we met nearly each month.

We called the celebration "Schulz Spur Nove". My son, Jonathan Anderson created the name, logo and website for people to register for the celebration and also for people to access important information regarding the celebration. About 400 people from 17 states, Canada and 3 from Italy attended the celebration. It was a joyful celebration with nonstop conversations and sharing of heritage stories. We were very fortunate to have John Contratto share delightful Italian music before and during our Saturday meal.

A wonderful addition to our gathering was the visit of a delegation from Italy. Ms Silvia Bartolini, President of "Consulta degli Emiliano-Romagnoli nel Mondo" and Christa Collina who met with the descendants. One of the aims of their activities is to keep and strengthen the links between the citizens of the milia-Romagna Region who emigrated abroad and their homeland. President Enrico Belgrado of Italian Art of Living, a nonprofit organization whose mission is to spread the Italian culture abroad through food, gave a presentation at the celebration and brought Italian cheese and balsamic vinegar for people to taste.

We lined up on the entrance ramp to Captain's Walk like a determined crew of sailors ready for their maiden voyage at this new venue. Our trusty first mate, Ron Bernard, coached us into 3 shots for posterity and one just for fun - with hands and hats raised high.

Then it was off to the river. Walking along the trail was exhilarating. Warm summer breezes off the Fox tickled bare skin like soft caresses. A lovely experience after the deep freeze we'd endured this past winter. And we certainly weren't alone. Members kept an eye out during conversations for bicyclists sharing the trail and green space this evening. But, all in all, everyone enjoyed the saunter and conversation. Primed for dinner, everyone was now ready for air conditioning, appetizers, and vino!

This was a winery, after all. What better way to experience it, than by some wine tasting. And taste we did! Selections sampled were from the regular tasting, which included seven pours from a choice of 13 varieties of whites and reds. From refreshing and citrusy whites, to pink and

crisp rose's, to dark and luscious reds, everyone found something to like and linger over. Choices were determined by each member. Which was the really fun part. Our hostess provided brochures with descriptions of each wine. The phrase belly-up-to-the-bar lingered in the air as members clustered in pairs or triads perusing brochures, while weighing the pros and cons of each vintage. Glassware for the whites was stemmed and for the reds was stemless, which encouraged more swirling, smelling and lingering. Everyone found something enjoyable!

Amidst the tasting, members strolled between rooms for hors d'oeuvres. Noshing was the other venue for this evening.

Members shared a cheese and meat platter, sour cream and spinach/artichoke dip, sliced baguettes, caprese skewers, chicken salad sandwich croissants, and Italian meatballs in red sauce. A bit into the tast-



ing, we also sampled two types of pizza: a white margarita style with ricotta cheese, and a traditional red sauce, mozzarella and sausage.

Following our noshing, we were treated to a brief but very interesting history of the house and winery, complete with ghost stories about "Helen" one of the unmarried daughters of the original owner. Seems she was not able to live out her final days in the house and ended up selling it. A change that didn't sit well with Helen.

Now, no one said the house was haunted,

But, as the story goes Helen's spirit (it is believed by those who have lived in and worked at Captain's Walk subsequently) still walks the halls and stairways - letting her presence be known whenever there are changes made in the house.
