Venite in Italia!...Buon Viaggio

The Italian Language students of Preble and East High Schools are raising funds in preparation for a trip to Italy this June. It will be a special ten day trip with accommodations far from typical of student travel and one that lends itself well to the grandparent or mentor type of club member that has wisdom to share and wants to experience Italia anew with the youthful vigor of a teenager. Our club members are rich with wisdom and would be a great asset to us on this educational venture. To this end we have selected an allinclusive trip with only 3 or 4 star- cen-

trally located hotels, a private air conditioned motor coach with door to door service and a certified Italian tour guide. Also included is a buffet breakfast in the hotel before leaving and the late afternoon or early evening 4-5 course meals as well as any tickets or entry fees required.

After several years of trip shopping and checking into arrangements with and without trip companies we can confidently share the reason for our selection of the **Cultural Heritage Alliance or CHA Tours.** This is the first educational travel company in the US and is 45 years old. The company was started by two teachers in Italy and due to longstanding business associations there, they offer a value that I have not been able to match elsewhere. Many school groups travel with a company called EF Tours, CHA is normally more expensive for a variety of reasons but this year they are celebrating their 45 anniversary and have not raised the prices from last year.

We are traveling to Roma, Pompeii, Sorrento, The Island of Capri and La Grotta Azzurra, Firenze, San Gimignano, Venezia and Milano. The trip is entitled Gems of Italy and can be seen in greater detail at CHA-Tours.com.

The price for folks over 21 years of age with accommodations of generally two to a room is \$4,400.00. It is truly worry free travel. There is a small up fee for single rooms or to change the return date on your ticket if interested.

The students have been working hard to raise funds at places like the Packer Stadium for stunt cards or Barnes and Nobles for gift wrapping. They are holding raffles and selling various items including the **Kwik Trip gas cards** that they receive ten percent of all sales for. **Please consider buying a gas card.** There are Kwik Trips in Green Bay on Lombardi Avenue near Tundra Lodge, Shawano Avenue near

Packerland, 399 Cardinal Lane in Howard, East Mason St. near Happy Joe's and on GV near 172. The cards come in \$10, \$20, \$25, \$50, and \$100 values. If a \$50 card is ordered then the students get \$5. And the buyer still gets the full fifty dollars in gas or grocery there.

Support from club members in the way of any donations or gas card purchases is greatly appreciated and will help offset costs to ensure that more students are able to travel.

Donations can be made out to the Preble Italian Club, 2222 Deckner Avenue which holds the fundraising account for both schools and cards may be ordered through Lisa Meli at (920)562-7327.
