Although Dante's "Comedy" has been admired for 700 years, the modern world has felt a special urgency in recovering the vision Dorothy Sayers once called "the drama of the soul's choice." Indeed, Pope Francis has invited the faithful to turn to the Comedy in the Year of Mercy "to rediscover the lost or obscured meaning of our human path," calling its author "a prophet of hope." In this course, Dr. Jason Baxter shows how Dante's poem can be read as a guide to the spiritual life.

The dates for this year's festival are Friday, Aug. 19, from 6 to 11 p.m. and Saturday, Aug. 20, from noon to 11 p.m.

The festival is set to take place in the city parking lot located at the **intersection of East A Street and Iron Mountain Street.** This family-friendly event encourages residents and visitors to celebrate the local Italian heritage with local food, drinks and music.

Attendees will enjoy performances from Next Myle, Anastasia Lee, Jan & Gino and the ever popular Cadillacs with Tom Gursky serving as master of ceremonies.

The beer and wine tent will be stocked with local and Italian beverages available throughout the festival. Musical entertainment and lively events will run throughout the day with the Italian Market offering fresh 2016 merchandise for purchase.

Additional events include bocce ball, inflatable children's play area, and face painting, as well as the customary Grape Stomp, Italian Idol and Pizza Dough Tossing competition.

New to this year's festival is a competition for Iron Mountain's best Italian pasta sauce which will take place Friday evening. Local amateur chefs will compete to be the champion of "Nonna's Secret Sauce."

In addition, a "Spaghetti Dinner Toss" will take place on Saturday afternoon that will captivate young and old. Tour de Dickinson will also be returning the morning of Italian Fest, providing riders with free admission into the festival.

Tickets are \$6 at the entrance with proceeds benefiting the Iron Mountain DDA which works to support economic development, historic preservation and the revitalization of Iron Mountain's central business district.
