<u>La Tavola di San Giuseppe</u> (Table of St. Joseph)

It's Religious, Cultural, Traditional, & Artistic!

The Table of St. Joseph is a centuries old tradition dating back to about the fourteenth century, a time of great poverty and famine in Sicily. During that time, people subsisted on fava beans, generally used to feed the cattle. People turned to St. Joseph to intercede with God for rain. Eventually the rains came and the fields yielded bountiful crops. In thanksgiving, the people made a table dedicated to St. Joseph on his feast day, March 19. The table was laden with bread, bread sculptures, fruits, vegetables, pasta, and wine. All who lived in the village were invited, especially the less fortunate. The custom of preparing a St. Jo-



seph table was introduced in America during the migration of Southern Italians and Sicilians in the latter part of the 19th century. Traditionally, after viewing the table, guests are given a fava bean to be carried in a pocket or purse yielding good luck and a guarantee that you will never go hungry. Any food that is leftover is donated to a homeless

shelter or any charitable organization designated by those creating La Tavola de San Giuseppe. In Italy today, March 19 is celebrated as Festa del Papa.
