Supported by the **Italian Community Center** and its generous community partners, **Festa** carries on time-honored traditions including the celebration of Sunday Mass and Procession, cultural exhibits, bocce, gondolas, photos of the old **Third Ward** and Italians in **Milwaukee**, as well as delicious food and entertainment true to the Italian culture including opera, dance, song and fireworks!


